LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

1983 General Meeting

Friday evening's hospitality house featured Oregon wines and excellent cheeses for members to sip and munch while they greeted old friends and made the acquaintance of many new ones. This is the time everyone talks shop - Dexters.

Saturday morning, after our visit to the cow pen, found us all assembled at 10:00 AM for the meeting. Kay Baker's minutes follow:

I. Dexter Cow Standards

President Johnson read the Standards for the Dexter Cow as presented by Don Piehota, chairman, and his Standards Committee:

Also, the Scale of Points for the Dexter Cow.

Discussion.

Standards for cow be adopted except indicate Ideal not requirement as it does in Preamble to Bull Standards.

> Motion - Hays 2nd - Harrell Carried

Lots of time and work spent on the standards. Thank you! to the committee for a job well done.

Discussion of printing standards and points in a form easily distributed to members for use at fairs, judging, etc. Inclusion of standards and points somewhere probably in Herd book. Bull Standard is in current Herd Book. Cow standard will be added along with Points for both.

II. Artificial Insemination

The discussion was led by John Hays as Jim Johnson felt he had a conflict of interest as a distributor. There was input by Sandi Thomas who has semen for sale, Maryam Young who is an A.I. Inseminator and numerous others.

Any time semen is used other than on your own farm on your own animals, certain requirements must be met to sell the semen and to register the calves.

II. Artificial Insemination - - continued

Requirements for selling semen:

- 1. quarantine of animal to be drawn
- 2. blood-typing of animal to be drawn
- 3. blood-typing of parents of animal to be drawn

State requirements are different - - Association requirements are different. The Dexter Cattle Association needs its own guidelines. Recommended that committee be set up to establish:

- 1. procedure for A. I. bulls and
- 2. procedure for animals produced by A. I.
- 3. committee consist of : Jim Johnson, chairman
 Kay Baker
 Sandi Thomas and
 Maryam Young

Above committee to meet after general meeting and come up with workable guidelines to be used until the next general meeting when they can be adopted. Motion -Hays, 2nd - Harrell, Carried.

Speakers.

Clair Madsen, Field Representative Cooper Animal Health and Charles Frady, Sales Representative American Cyanamid Co. talked, showed films and distributed handouts regarding parasite control and treatment. A healthy animal produces healthy calves, gains weight faster and tastes better on your plate. Calfhood diseases preventable through cow vaccination. First milk from cow provides protection to offspring. Maternal antibodies gone by 6 months - re-vaccinate, Time vaccination when it produces peak immunity - when it is needed most. Check with your local veterinarian to find out best time in your area. Vaccines, wormers and pour-ons all go towards keeping an animal healthy and at peak production.

General Discussion on:

- Dexter Inquiries. Still receiving a number of letters and calls. Interest
 in Mid-west and East leans towards milking and West tends toward
 breeding.
- Question of Name. Irish Dexter American Dexter English Dexter etc.
 Discussion. Association refer to animals as Dexter. Brochure is
 being revised droping "Irish". The Dexter Cattle.
- Meeting location for 1984. Several possible locations discussed: Trapper Creek, Alaska, California, etc. Probably time to go east we have been west of the Mississippi River for the last 4 years.

General Discussion - continued

- 4. Division of Regions. Rocky Mountain and Pacific regions spread out could they be divided into a third region. Discussion. Difficult to change distribution of regions each time the population shifts.
 - 5. Starting Kit. Discussion. Provide information to the new and old members as to tattooing, registration information, fees, etc.

 Information sheet to new members. Motion, Jef Jalof 2nd, Hays Carried
 - 6. Registration costs:

under 1 year \$10,00 1 - 2 years 25,00 over 2 years 50,00 transfer 10,00

Forms need to be up-dated. This will be done by Kay Baker.

- 7. Animal count. Discussion. Getting a count of animals and keeping it up-to-date. Need to keep registrations and transfers current and the reporting of deceased stock.

A.I. Committee Meeting and Results - 7/16/83.

Jim Johnson, Kay Baker, Sandi Thomas and Maryam Young met into the wee hours of the night discussing the following aspects of artificial insemination:

Blood typing of donor bull, sire and dam.

Association receives test results.

Permit number assigned.

Benefits association, not the individual.

Blood testing costs borne by individual.

Association waive on blood testing if animal is unavailable or deceased. (sire & dam)

Waiver of blood typing sire and dam at discretion of association.

Blood work is done at Ohio State University.

Breeding certificate to be signed by A. I. Technician.

Data contained on inseminator's certificate such as: Sire #, Dam #,
Straw # and date.

Liability insurance.

After carefully weighing each of the above items, the committee presented the following Guidelines for A.I. to be used in the interim until next year's meeting:

Donor bull must be blood typed and tested.

Sire and dam must be blood typed if they are available - waiver possible.

Permit number issued by Secretary.

Technician's Certificate necessary to register progeny from A. I. bull.
