MORE COMMENTS ON THE BY-LAWS REVISION

FROM SHEP SPRINGER, FT COLLINS, CO:

" A few words, as a member of the By-Laws Revision Committee, but speaking only for myself. We are the American Dexter Association, and I do not feel we have excluded anyone from membership in the organization. To be a voting member and hold office, one must be a resident of the USA. Anyone residing outside the USA is eligible to be an associate member. Granted, this is a change from the old By-Laws. But again, this is the American Dexter Association. I see no reason for concern on the part of any of our membership. "

FROM RUSS BERRY, PORTLAND, ONTARIO:

" First, regarding the proposed residency By-Law provision. John Hays seems to find it 'hard to believe any of our Canadian Friends would take amiss an adoption of their own membership scheme.' I would like to take this opportunity to very strongly disabuse him of that notion. It is looked upon by everyone I have talked with as "tit for tat", and it would appear that many of our American friends hold the same view.

Rudy Gilster is quite correct when he notes that the CDCA is bound by the Canadian government, more specifically the "Animal Pedigree Act" 35-36-37 Elizabeth 2nd Chapter 13 - An Act Respecting Animal Pedigree Associations. In short, we had no choice in the matter.

I would like to point out at that at this time close to 90% of the Dexters in Canada are bulldog-free, and new stock is being imported from the UK on an ongoing basis. The ADCA can only benefit from the CDCA.

The second letter I would like to reply to was from Paul and Judy Taylor. I also think it out of order for the By-Law committee to remain silent at the AGM considering the date of their report. The first portion of their letter, however, is mis-leading - "Merely because I am a Canadian does not imply that I agree with anything and everything the Canadian Association does." It is not a matter of agreement or not with the CDCA - it is a matter of obeying the law of the Land."

Today's definition of a Dexter is based on the original and unchanged 1892 English Breed Standards. They specify (Sect 4, Para 3) legs short, (especially from the knee to the fetlock).....".

Animals with this characteristic have been identified as having a genetic condition known as achondroplasia - one of the causes of dwarfism (in humans, as well). It is this acknowledged defect which produces both the stocky little classic dwarf Dexter and its side effect: bulldog calves (so called because of the head shape of the aborted fetus).

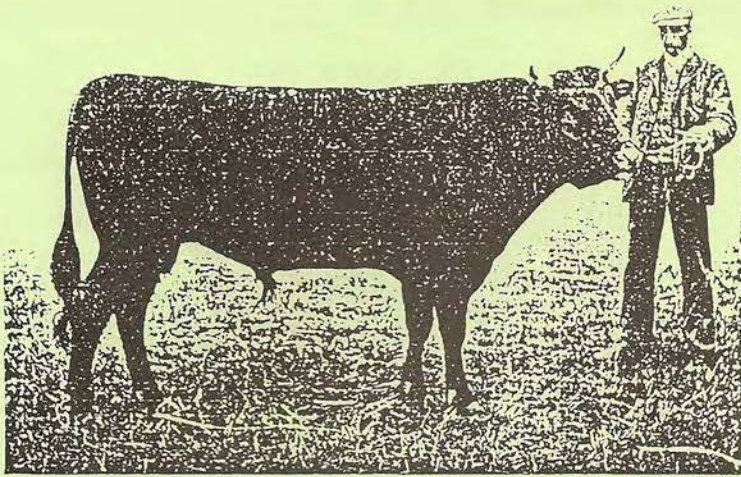
Unfortunately for the breed, achondroplasia is not a stable condition. When bred together, dwarf Dexters will never be capable of consistently generating offspring which always resemble both parents. Statistically half will be dwarf like the parents, a quarter will abort a deformed fetus and a quarter will be tall.

Dwarf Dexters average 36 - 40" and are chunky, mature-looking animals, even as calves.

There is another Dexter, known as the Kerry-type. These animals when bred together always breed true. That is, their offspring consistently resemble both parents 100% of the time. Kerry-type Dexters average 39 - 43" and resemble a small, proportionate Shorthorn.

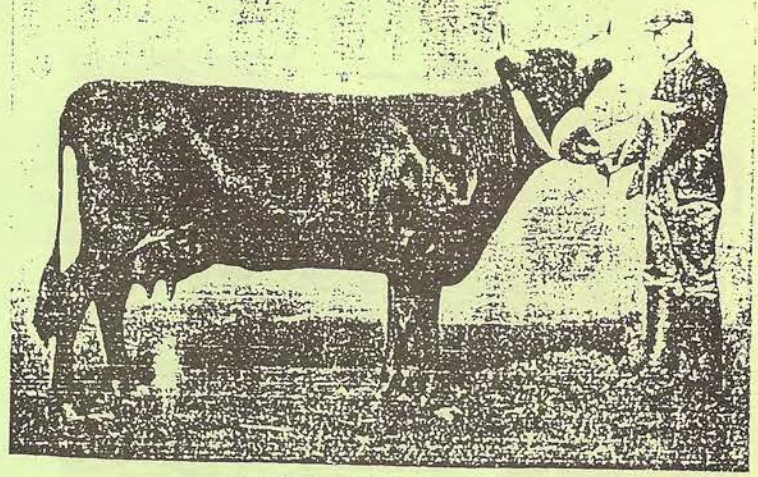
Keep in mind that in 1892 genetics was an unknown field. It was considered just a matter of time before the Kerry-type would be bred out, and dwarf Dexters would be stabilized. Yet in the intervening 100 years, the statistics on offspring have not changed.

In these historical photos, compare height and body shape between Kerrys and Kerry-type Dexters. Know also that for 150 years, serious Dexter breeders have been throwing out the Kerry-type, and keeping the dwarf (real) Dexter.

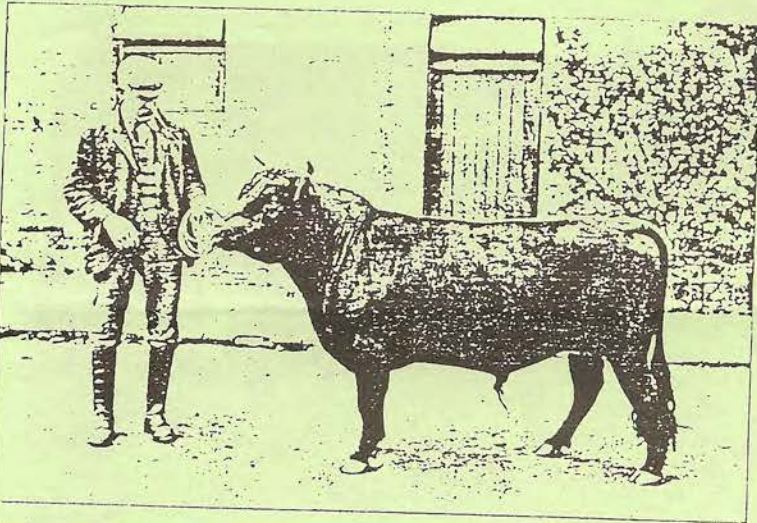
KERRY COW—"WALTON DASHIEL"

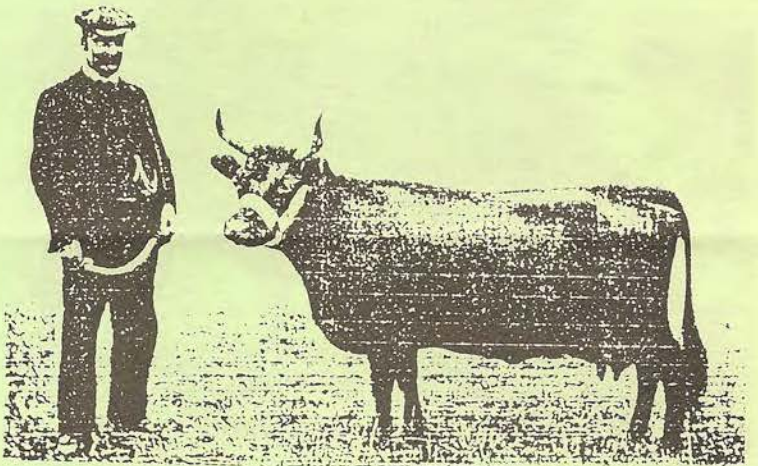

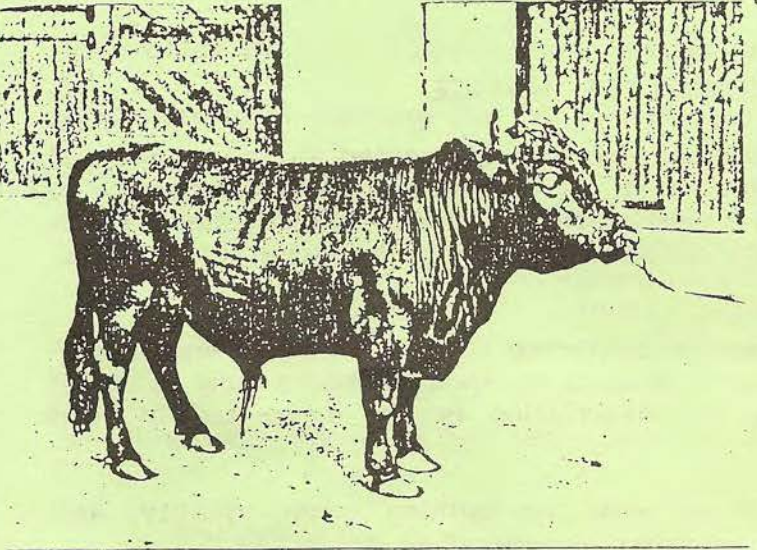
DEXTER COW—"COMPTON DOR"

Dear Lois,

We bought Lucifer of Knotting last spring, and have just had his semen drawn for A.I. We thought the Association members might be interested to know a little about Lucifer.

His mother and all four grandparents qualified for the English Register of Merit. (To qualify, a cow must produce or a bull must sire 4 cows who produced not less than 3,960 lbs. of milk in the 1st lactation, 5,500 lbs. of milk in the 2nd lactation, and 6,490 lbs. of milk in the 3rd lactation.

We have been spending a lot of time with him and have found he was not used to being handled and that he really missed human company. Since he has been with us he has become a most manageable animal.

We shall be sending a small flyer to all Association members detailing size, conformation and background on Lucifer and, in conjunction with Carol Davidson, on his uncle, Saturn of Knotting. This is so that the members can make an informed decision regarding the benefits the Knotting line can bring to their herds.

To be listed in every issue of the Bulletin and located in the 'semen available' section: **The semen listed below is from bulls selected by their owners and the Association has not evaluated the bulls in any way.**

A quote from one of the Association's flyers: "For those unable to keep their own bull the Dexter Association has an A.I. plan". To the ignorant such as me this means the Association has approved certain bulls that have the desired characteristics, a guarantee."

"While I would like to commend each Dexter breeder that collects a bull and makes it available to other breeders, I would like to suggest that the bull be collected not just 'because he is a nice, quiet bull with a gentle temperament'. While I may agree with this reasoning to a small degree I think a bull should be selected on so much more - one should consider sire and dam, perhaps even grand sire and grand dam, and certainly adult daughters should be seen to judge udder quality along with many other traits. For our breed to flourish we need to start to become more critical of our bull selection. I urge all breeders to consider these thoughts before they collect a bull or breed to such a selected A.I. bull.
