




FROM REGION #11, Sophia Stillerman, Director

Mr Langdon says the item was sent to him by a friend in Salisbury whom he is trying to interest in Dexter cattle for his large, mountainside farm.




Shanidar Jesse James # pending. 55 lbs, 24" high. Black bull calf with red genes.

Shanidar Lily # pending. 43 lbs, 24" high. Black heifer with red genes.




