

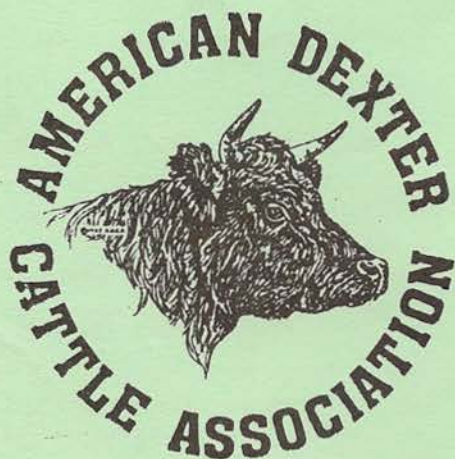

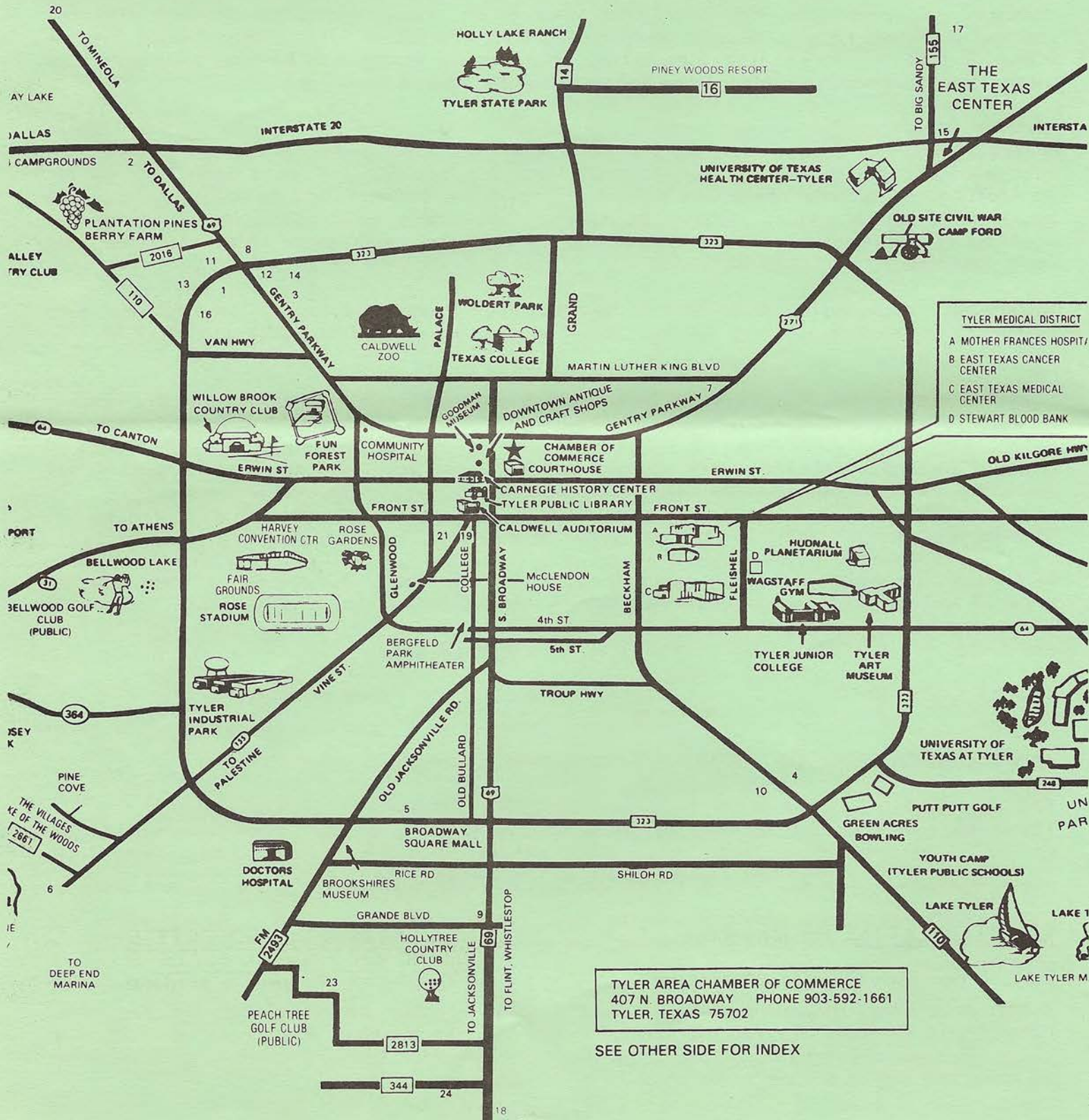

FROM REGION #11, Sophia Stillerman, Director

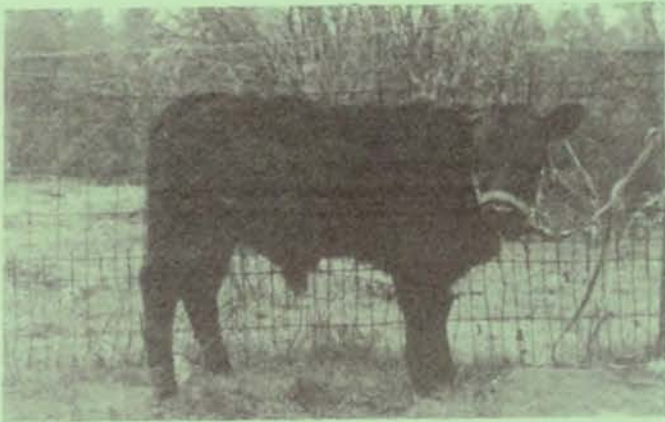

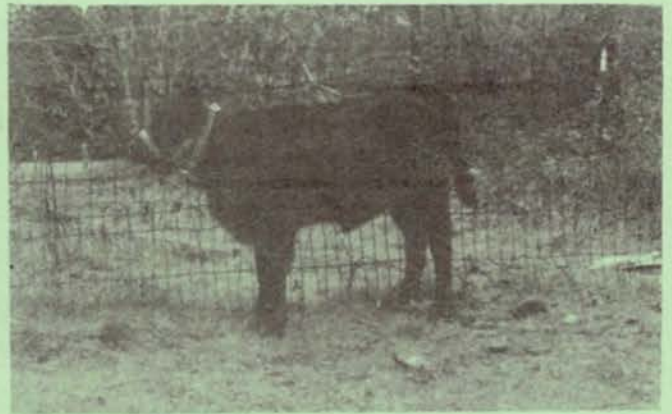

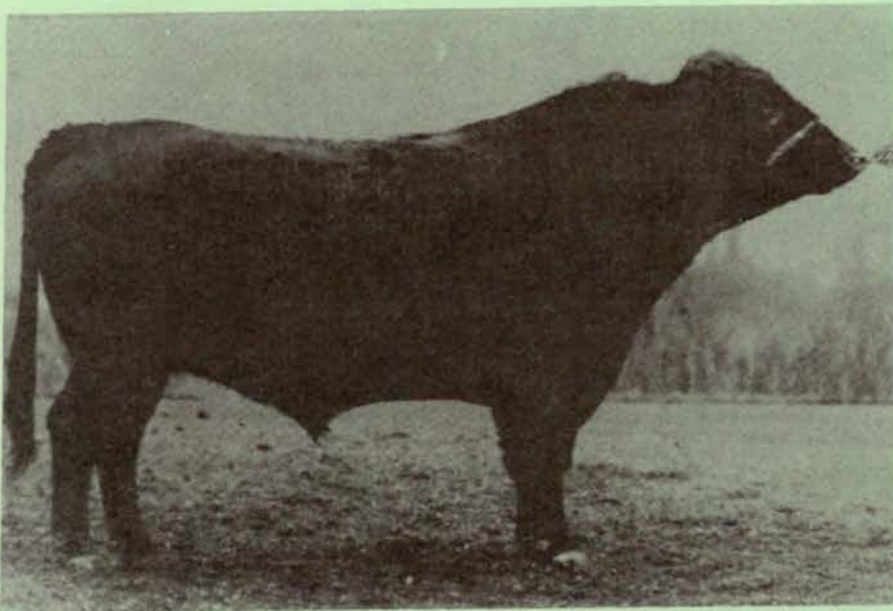
Shanidar Jesse James # pending.

genes.

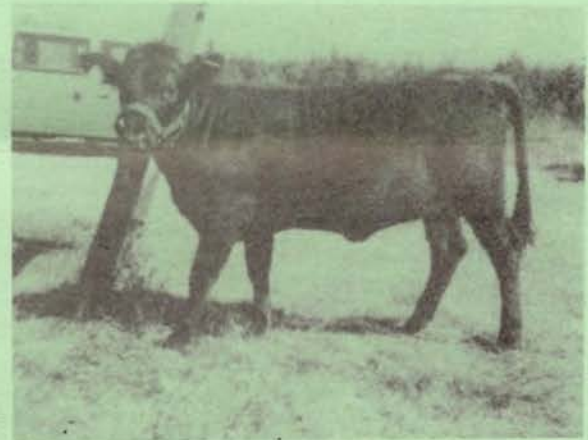
