

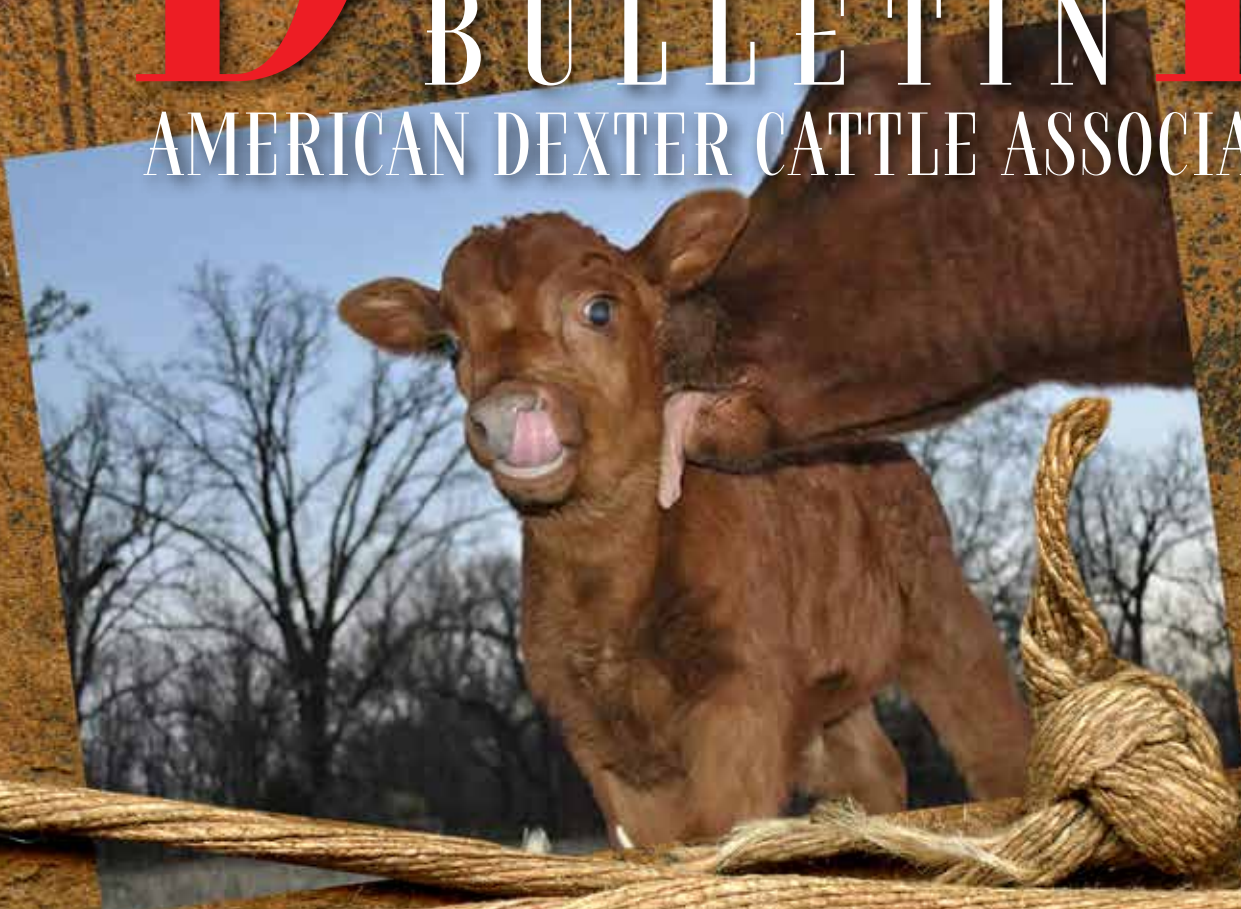

ADCA CODE OF ETHICS

As a member of the American Dexter Cattle Association, I agree that I will:

- Not knowingly make any untruthful statement in submitting applications for registry and not register animals of questionable parentage.

- Not neglect or mistreat my animal (s), but, on the contrary, at all times safeguard and further its/their well-being.

- Not transfer any animal to a party who I feel will not conscientiously look after its health, safety and well-being or may exploit or degrade or otherwise act to the detriment of the breed of animal.

- Only breed animals that I know to be in good condition and health.

- Represent my animals honestly to prospective buyers and give such advice or assistance to the buyer as may be reasonably requested.

- Keep on the alert for and work diligently to control potentially adverse effects of known genetically inherited conditions by educating prospective buyers regarding the implications associated with the presence of these conditions in a breeding program.

- So act in my breeding practice and in dealings with others as to protect and improve the good standing and reputation of the breed and of the association.

Congratulations to these ADCA members for earning the respect and admiration of their fellow Dexter owners!

The Chuck Daggett Good Citizen award is given in honor of Chuck Daggett, former ADCA Registrar and Webmaster. Chuck started the Daggett's Dexters herd in 1997. He became an active member of the ADCA, serving as Regional Director for Region 13 in 2003. In 2004, when a sudden split occurred in the ADCA at the AGM in Pennsylvania, Chuck volunteered to take on the task of Registrar and Webmaster. Since the association was left without past records or pedigrees from the old registry, Chuck worked many hours to reconstitute our historic pedigrees and rebuild the ADCA registry into the most up to date, most accurate record of pure-bred Dexter Cattle in the nation. The hours he spent on the

phone and writing emails to help Dexter owners with questions about registration, transfer, and stewardship of their herds were characteristic of his generosity to our community.

Chuck continued his work as Registrar and Webmaster until his passing in 2012. Chuck lived his life as a good citizen in his city, with his family, at his church, and especially in the Dexter cattle community. He was a true gentleman, always giving "above and beyond" to any who needed his help. He was a faithful educator to new Dexter owners, a true advocate for Dexter cattle, and a good, honest friend to all that knew him. His faithful service to the association during a pivotal period of our growth and his generous spirit toward all ADCA members will never be forgotten.

Horns, Scurs or Abnormal Horn Growth?

Since the introduction of polled genetics to the Dexter breed, it has been a question faced by our breeders. What is growing on this calf's head, horns or scurs? Those who are new to cattle may not have even heard of, or know what scurs are.

Scurs are defined as horn-like tissue attached to the skin instead of the skull. Scurring is a unique genetic condition completely unrelated to horned/polled genetics. Scurs are also not the result of an incomplete dehorning. Scurs can only grow if horns are not present,

either genetically or through a clean dehorning. They can vary greatly in size, looking like nothing more than a scab or getting quite long.

Females require two copies of the scur gene to grow scurs, while males only require one copy of the gene for scurs to grow. There is evidence that suggests that a homozygous polled animal will not grow scurs even if it does inherit the scur alleles.

Normal horn growth starts at a young age, around 4-5 weeks usually, and the

horns generally fasten to the skull by the time the calf is several months old. Scurs begin growth later, on the other hand, and can start growing as late as 12 months in heifers and 18 months in males. Scurs normally remain loose and wiggly, though there is some evidence that they can become semi-attached to the skull.

Before the DNA test for polledness was available, breeders with polled Dexters had to simply make an educated guess as to whether a calf was horned or scurred. You may think, as I did, that the difference is pretty obvious. And historically, if a breeder had a heifer with “things” growing on her head that were shorter & slower growing than normal horns and were still loose & wiggly at 7-8 months of age, they would most likely assume it was scurs, have them removed through a dehorning procedure and register the heifer as polled.

I bought just such a cow...and ended up with an education. As a 9 month old heifer, the breeder had her examined by two different vets. Both agreed that the heifer had scurs, since they were smaller than normal and still were not fastened to the skull. The breeder had the “scurs” removed and registered her, in good faith, as polled. Shortly after I bought her & her second calf was born, the polled DNA test became available. Knowing that both her sire & dam were heterozygous polled, and not trusting the ‘homozygous polled will not grow scurs’ theory, I decided to do the DNA test to see if she was hetero- or homo- polled. Her results came back...horned!

TO STEER OR NOT TO STEER?

Soon after you begin your wonderful journey within Dexterdom, you will encounter your first bull calf. With his large eyes and an expressive face, he will melt your heart. The sheer cuteness will overwhelm you and somebody will say: “I can’t eat him”. If you purchased Dexters just as pets (hopefully not) and have an abundance of space and funds, that’s ok. If, like the rest of us, you purchased Dexters to supply you and your family with beef, you’re about to take that first big step to self-sufficiency. Yes, as adorable as he is, you will raise this little guy to feed your family. Congratulations on becoming a farmer!

But what if you want to find a way to bypass his fate? You could register him and sell him as a bull! Stop right there. The market is flooded with mediocre bulls, most of which would have made only mediocre steers to begin with. Take a deep breath, remember why you wanted to raise Dexters and ask yourself if you have the experience to determine a quality bull calf from a cute one. A registration alone does not make a bull. Another scenario is that you’ve got some calving seasons under your belt and now you feel comfortable with selecting a bull calf as a potential herd sire. In both cases I hope the following flow chart and write-up will help you.

The first step is to realize that anything printed on paper is worthless if the bull calf in front of you doesn’t correspond to your vision and goal of breeding a superior bull. Chances are that

those test results or pedigrees are shared by many a Dexter, so forget about them at this time.

Your calf can only be as good as his parents, so let’s take a look at them. You should have been able to identify the one or two cows in your herd that are potential “bull mothers”. Such a cow is older and has never given you a problem. Her mothering skills are impeccable, she’s calved easily and has always bred back quickly. Her chunky calves are recognizably of a better quality than your other calves. Ideally she’s beyond her third or fourth lactation and her udder is still beautifully attached, with a level udder floor smoothly transitioning to a far-reaching foreudder and a high and wide rear udder attachment with a strong medial suspensory ligament. Her teats are widely and evenly spaced, of equal length and thickness. Her teats should lend themselves to hand-milking. The correctness of her structure will always draw your eye. She keeps her condition easily because she is so deep and wide. The length of her straight topline never ceases to amaze you. To top it off, she is friendly and docile in every situation.

Your bull calf’s sire is just as exceptional. His adult daughters are better than their dams. His steer calves have high hanging weights. All of his calves have been friendly and calm. He himself is a picture perfect Dexter. Long, deep and wide, with relatively little space between his belly and the ground, he moves like

an athlete. His testicles are evenly shaped, the scrotal package without deformities, but with a pronounced backswing. His teats are evenly spaced and well in front of the neck of the scrotum. He is the perfect, respectful gentleman to you and within his herd. He breeds his cows early in the season because he is so fertile.

Both parents of your bull calf are well within the height recommendations, they are neither extremely short nor tall.

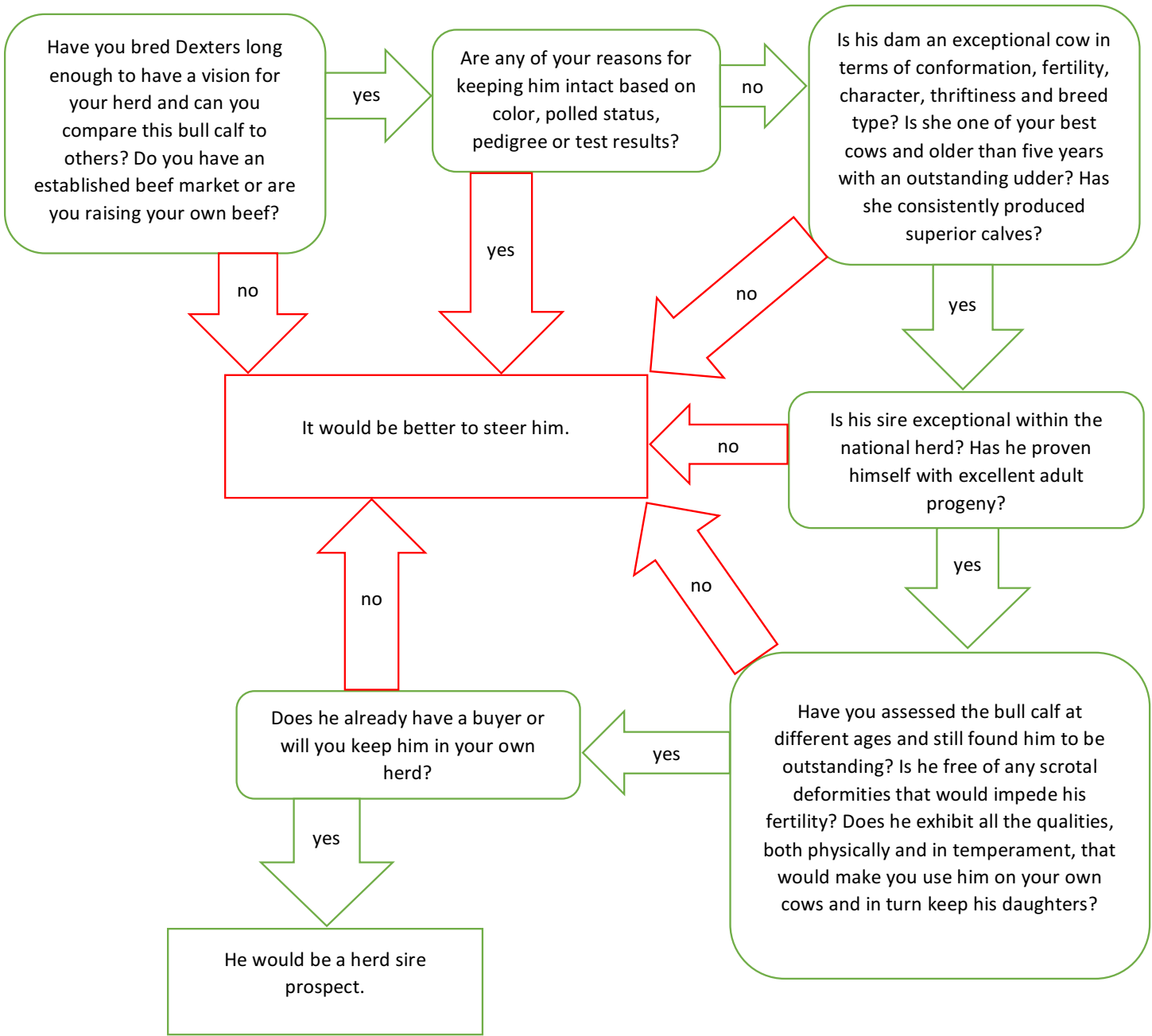
Now let's give your bull calf our attention. When he was born, you knew he was a bull just by seeing his face. He has a bit of a swagger about him, he knows his worth. He is also just as conformationally correct as his parents are, regardless of his age and maturity. He is easy to work with, yet respectful. You would really like to keep him, since he's one of the best calves

you've ever seen. Maybe you will. On the other hand, you've had inquiries about potential herd sires from within the Dexter community because your homebred heifers have given you a good reputation.

It's a long process, isn't it? On average, only one bull calf out of twenty should be considered as being "bull worthy". Maybe it's easier to be picky about your heifers and not even think twice about castrating your bull calves. I also hope that this article helps those that are shopping for a herd sire, be it a mature bull or a prospect. On a side note: "proven" only means that the individual got the job done, but it also means you can ask for pictures of his offspring.

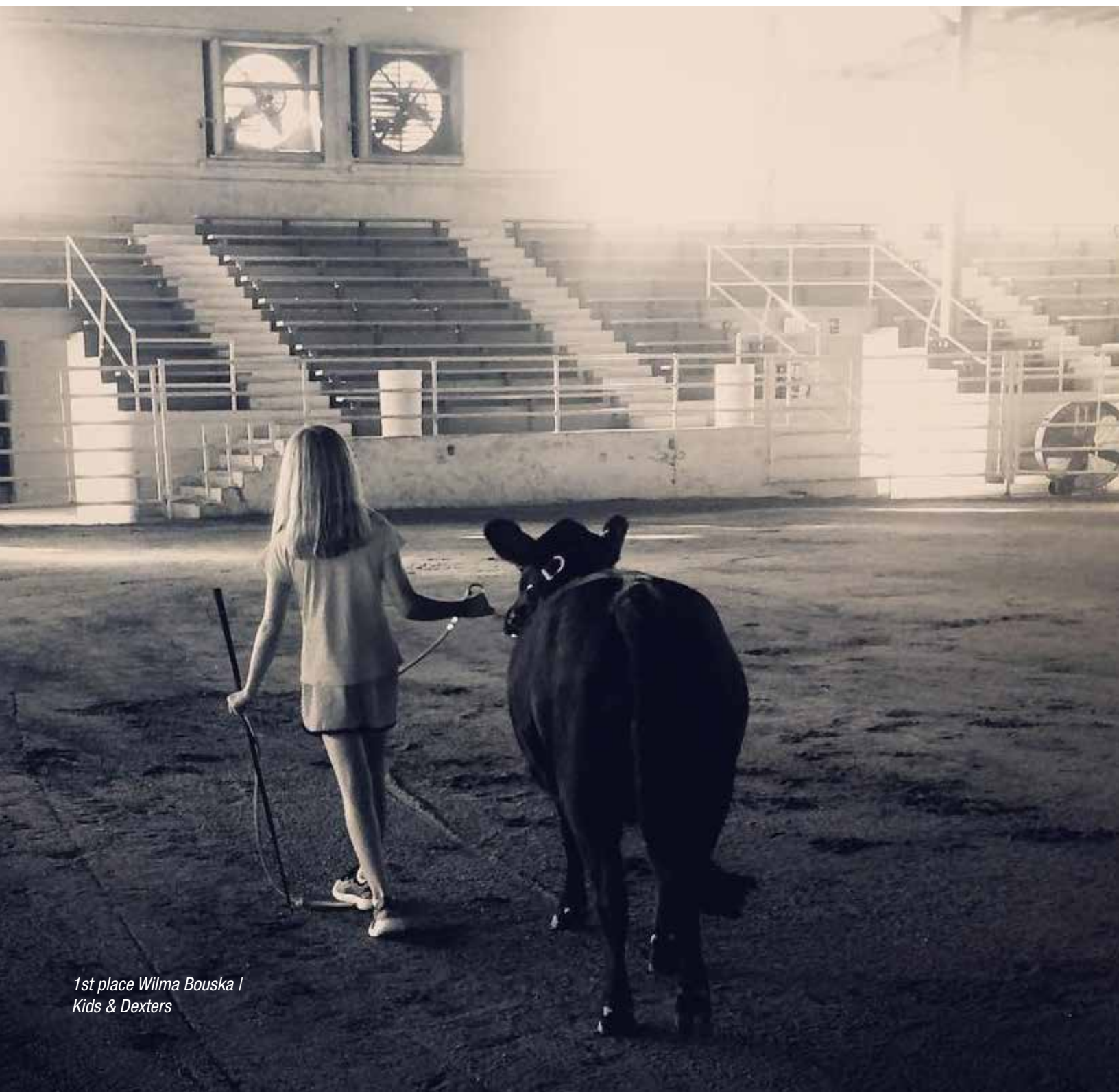
